If you see someone who is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and you say to them, "Go in peace, get warm and fed," without giving them the warm clothes and food they need, what good is that? Faith by itself without action is not living out the Gospel message.

This story is a real challenge us all to care for the needy in whatever way we can.


